Theodore Roosevelt, born on October 27, 1858, in New York City, was the 26th president of the United States, serving from 1901 to 1909. He was a multifaceted figure, known as a writer, naturalist, and soldier. Roosevelt became president following the assassination of William McKinley and was the youngest person to assume the presidency at the age of 42. His presidency is noted for expanding the powers of the federal government and the presidency itself, particularly in mediating conflicts between big business and labor, and for steering the U.S. toward a more active role in international politics.

Roosevelt's domestic policy, known as the "Square Deal," focused on consumer protection, controlling corporations, and conserving natural resources. He was a proponent of "trust-busting," using the Sherman Antitrust Act to break up monopolies and regulate corporations. His administration also saw the establishment of the Bureau of Corporations and the passage of the Pure Food and Drug Act and the Meat Inspection Act.

Quick Access Tools

Share: Send articles and images via email, Google Classroom, Google Drive, or Microsoft Teams.

Favourite: Quickly add an article to your Favourites or Resource Packs. This is a great way of planning for a research project and gathering content in advance.

Print: Print the article from your device.

Cite: Generate citations easily in MLA, APA, Harvard, or Chicago style.

Translate: Translate the article into more than 100 languages using machine translation, powered by Google Translate.

Listen: Have the article read out loud. This tool highlights the text to help users follow along with the audio.

Font Up and Down: Increase or decrease the article's font size for accessibility.

Media View

Article: View the main content dedicated to this topic.

Images & Video: Isolate the article's media to one view.

Related: Jump to other articles within Britannica Academic for additional reading.

Article History: Get transparency into when the article was last updated and what was changed.

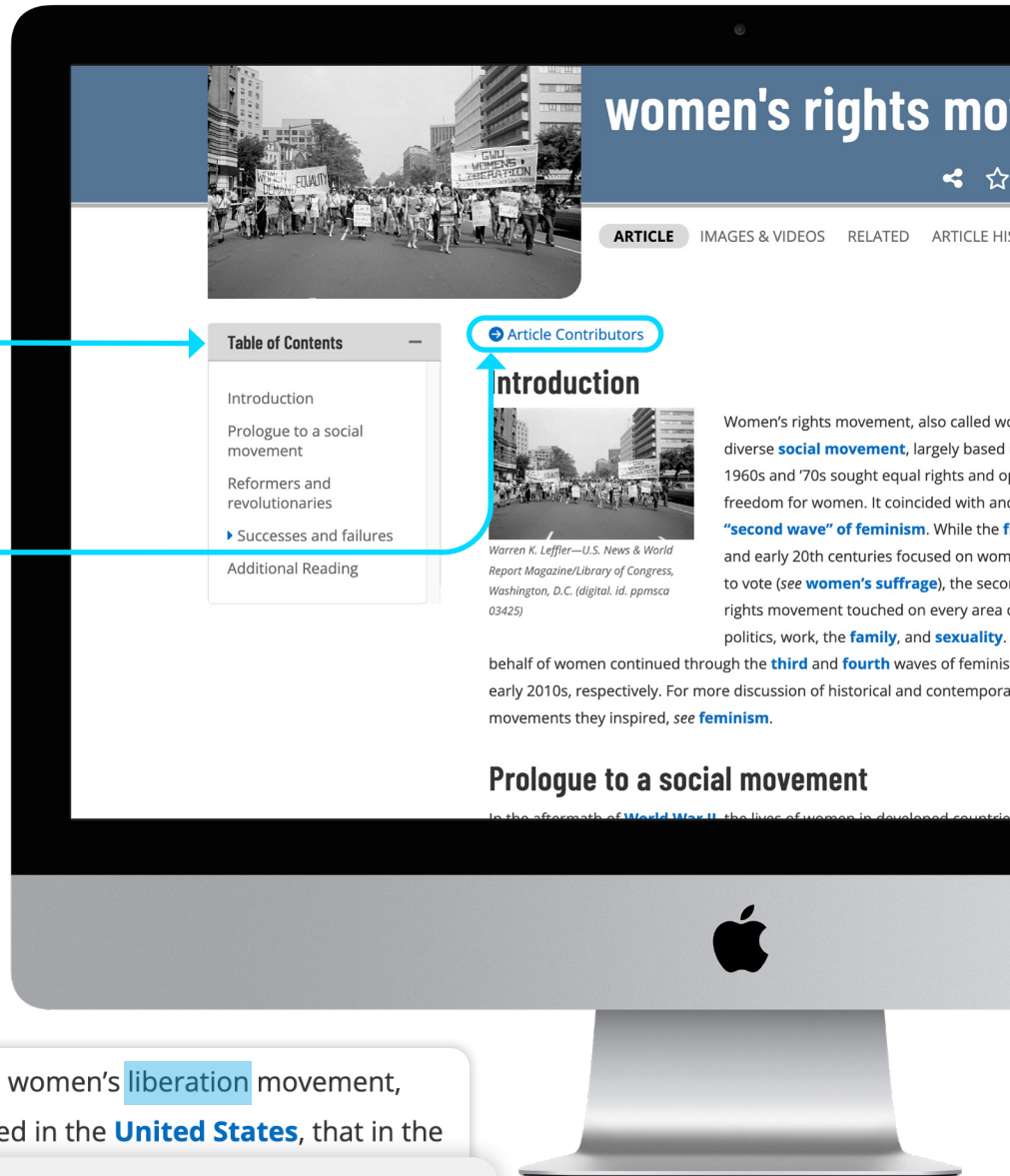

My Research

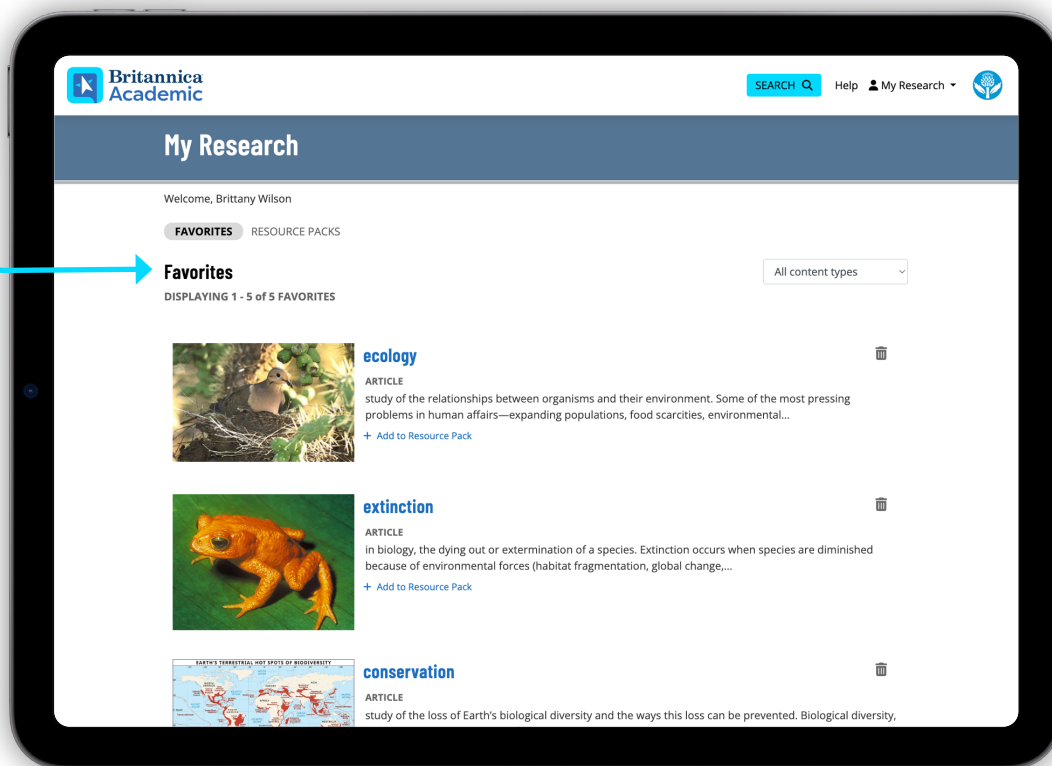
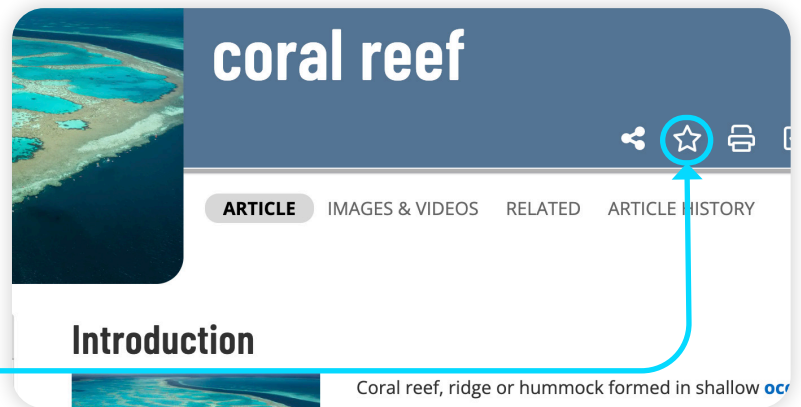

Account Setup

While you do not need an account to explore Britannica Academic, setting one up lets you save articles and media to reference later. Use the **My Research** button in the top-right corner of any page to sign in.

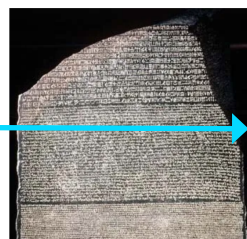
